

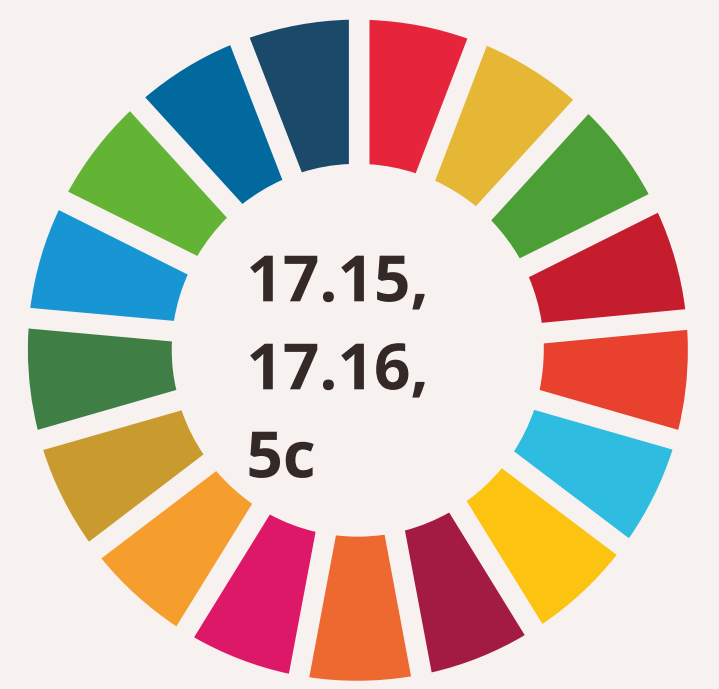
Global Partnership for Effective Development Co-operation (GPEDC) in Latin America and the Caribbean



The countries of Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) have participated in the 3 monitoring rounds of the GPEDC, in the 2018 round 11 countries of the 33 countries in these regions participated (1 third).

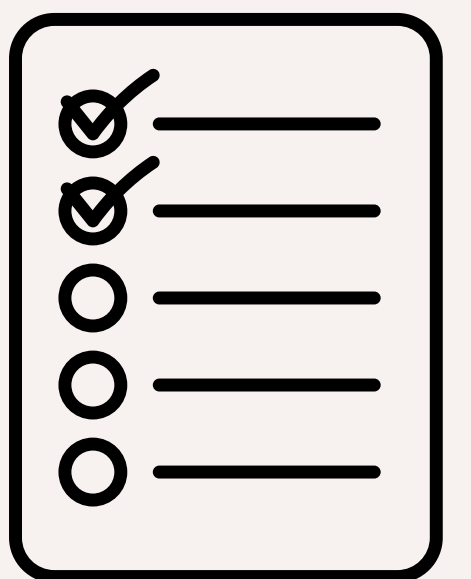
The national development strategy and results framework...

- 91% ... defines priorities, targets and indicators
- 55% ... includes budget or costing information
- 55% ... aligns to SDGs
- 82% Regular progress reports are available

- 1) are based on objectives prioritized by the national development strategy: 84%
- 2) use indicators included in the country's own results frameworks: 52%
- 3) use government data and statistics for monitoring: 39%
- 4) involve the government in evaluation exercises. 55%

Development Partners' use of Country Systems



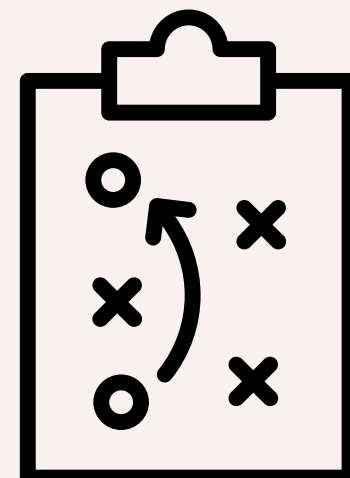
